In June 2020, Morag Ellis QC was appointed as the Dean of the Arches and Auditor and Master of Faculties. As such, she is the senior ecclesiastical judge in England and the statutory regulator, under the

Mae'r Athro Thomas Glyn Watkin CF (hc) yn offeiriad ordeiniedig yn yr Eglwys yng Nghymru a bu'n Gynorthwydd Cyfreithiol i'w Gorff Llywodraethol rhwng 1981 a 1998. Bu'n Gwnsler Deddfwriaethol Cyntaf Llywodraeth Cymru rhwng 2007 a 2010, a bu gynt yn Athro y Gyfraith ym Mangor (2004-2007), lle sefydlodd Ysgol y Gyfraith, ac yng Nghaerdydd (2001-2004). Bydd yr Athro Watkin yn annerch cyd-destun hanesyddol a chyfredol deddfu mewn perthynas â'r Eglwys yng Nghymru.

Matthew Chinery yw'r Cwnsler Cyffredinol a Phennaeth Gwasanaethau Cyfreithiol yr Eglwys yng Nghymru. Bu gynt yn Uwch Gyfreithiwr Cyswllt yn Winckworth Sherwood LLP ac yn Gofrestrydd Esgobaethol Esgobaethau Chichester a St Albans yn Eglwys Loegr. Bydd Matthew yn trafod sut mae'r setliad dadsefydlu a 'olion sefydlu' yn parhau i effeithio ar lywodraethu cyfreithiol o fewn yr Eglwys yng Nghymru a'i pherthynas â chymdeithas Cymru heddiw.

Professor Thomas Glyn Watkin QC (*hc*) is an ordained priest in the Church in Wales and was Legal Assistant to its Governing Body from 1981 until 1998. He was First Legislative Counsel to the Welsh Government from 2007 until 2010, and had previously been Professor of Law at Bangor (2004–2007), where he founded the Law School, and at Cardiff (2001–2004). Professor Watkin will address the history and present context of law-making with regards to the Church in Wales.

Matthew Chinery is the General Counsel and Head of Legal Services at the Church in Wales, having previously been a Senior Associate Solicitor at Winckworth Sherwood LLP and the Diocesan Registrar to the Dioceses of Chichester and St Albans in the Church of England. Matthew will discuss how the disestablishment settlement and the 'vestiges of establishment' continues to affect legal governance within the Church in Wales and its relationship with Welsh society today.
